## Southern Alberta Chinese Canadian Oral History Project

### *The Project*

This Southern Alberta Chinese Canadian Oral History project is in partnership with The University of Calgary Information Services and Simon Fraser University Library Services. **Len Lee** and **Jasmin Poon** are managers and videographers of the project.

The Sien Lok Society has continually focused on initiatives that advance and preserve Chinese Canadian culture and heritage. Consequently, this project was seen as an important legacy project and granted funding by the Society in 2005. The Society has supported similar ventures in the past including the need to safeguard the Calgary's Chinatown and the development of Sien Lok Park.

The project funds video interviews with Chinese Canadians about their family history including their immigration to Canada. The current focus is primarily on early Chinese immigrants, who arrived in the late 1800's to early 1900's. These immigrants would have been charged the Chinese head tax during the years from 1885 - 1923. Because many of those immigrants have since departed, we have been interviewing their dependants or immediate descendants.

### *Purpose*

The purpose of the project is to preserve the history of early Chinese immigration and settlement to Canada in an oral, video format. Each stand-alone interview will be accessible on the internet for researchers and anyone else who is interested in early Chinese Canadian immigration history. Because these interviews are captured on the World Wide Web, a very large audience can be reached.

### *History*

**1885 - 1923:** Federal government implements head tax to Chinese immigrants, ranging from \$50 to \$500 per person.

**July 1, 1923:** Chinese Immigration Act, notoriously, also known as the Chinese Exclusion Act went into effect allowing only Chinese merchants to immigrate.

The Exclusion Act in essence, separates family members who are living in Canada or China.

**May 17, 1947:** Repeal of the Chinese Exclusion Act. Chinese are allowed to immigrate to Canada as independent immigrants, ending overt racial discrimination.

**October 8, 1971:** Federal Multiculturalism policy adopted. It was the first official multicultural policy to be adopted in the world.

### Oral History Candidates

An invaluable part of our heritage is the oral recollections of our elders. In southern Alberta, our primary focus will be on conducting video interviews with elders in the Chinese Canadian community. Here is a general description of those candidates that we would like to interview.

- Those who have experienced or have memory of events such as the Head Tax (1885 - 1923) and the Chinese Exclusion Act (1923 - 1947).
- Those who were typically born in Canada before 1947 or immigrated before 1947.
- Those who are a survivor, spouse or descendent of a Head Tax Payer.
- Those who have memories of their parents or grandparents early experiences of immigrating to Canada.
- Those who have photos, documents or memorabilia from the above and can relate stories of their value in history.

## What's Happening with Sien Lok Park?

### *Sien Lok Park Master Plan*

The Parks Committee held a Master Plan Workshop on March 14, 2007 to review concepts that were presented by Landscape Architect **Peter Wiseman**. The event was held at the new downtown offices of **Cohos Evamy Integratedesign**. Sixteen people were in attendance.

The first part of the workshop focused on the goals for the Park. The concepts discussed ranged from the park as a central outdoor gathering place, a place for all ages and ethnicities, a reflection of the contribution that the Chinese have made to the city, and a location that embraces the Bow River.

The next part of the discussion examined the urban issues that affect the Park. Some of the many issues covered was the fact that Riverside Avenue splits the park into two, concealed spaces and public safety, shadow casting by tall buildings, limited visual connection between the Park and Centre Street, planting clutter, segregation from the Bow River, poor turf quality and the need to upgrade existing facilities.

Mr. Wiseman also enquired about the appropriate imagery for the Park. Should there be traditional or modern elements located within the Park? It was generally acknowledged by the group that there should be a combination of both.

The final part of the discussion revolved around what site-specific strategies should be adopted to achieve the goals of the Sien Lok Society and more importantly, the Calgary community at large.

After these discussions, two breakout groups formulated what additional improvements should be made to the Park over the short and long term. The groups reformed, after some quick brainstorming. From these deliberations, it was clear that a strategic direction needed to be formulated by the Sien Lok Society so that the Master Plan process could move forward.

Consequently, it was decided that a subcommittee should be established to make a recommendation on the appropriate strategic direction for the Park. After the meeting, **Ray Lee, Thomas To, Edmond Lee, Kevin Wong** and **Robert Jim** volunteered to be on this sub-committee. This committee will convene and provide recommendations to the Board before the Master Plan is advanced.

### *Banners in the Park*

The City of Calgary is currently working on erecting these banners sometime before the summer. The Parks Committee is in constant contact with the City to review the status of this work. Please stay tuned for further information on this topic.

### *Repainting of the Pagoda*

**Carl Wu** will be contacting painting contractors in the near future to discuss the costs of repairing and repainting of the existing Pagoda. It is hoped that this work will be completed by the end of the summer.
