## President’s Message

Welcome to our “New Year” issue. I would like to take this opportunity to personally wish each and everyone a happy 2009, and a healthy and prosperous Year of the Ox. Since our last issue, the global systemic crisis has created major uncertainty in our economy, not seen since the Great Depression of the 1930’s. It is a situation that has touched everyone. The prognosticators for the Year of the Ox are recommending that it is “a time to be persistent without being pushy. A practical down to earth approach will serve better than elaborate strategies for many of us”. With this apparent downturn, Sien Lok Society’s mission and service to the City and to Calgary’s Chinese community is as important and relevant, as it has ever been and we will strive to “stay the course” for the long term.

During the last few months, some events have occurred that will help sculpt the face and attitude of Sien Lok in the coming years. The most important of these activities included a series of three Visioning Sessions with the Board, facilitated by Windchill Ha, to determine the “road map” for the Society over the next two years. Major concepts included maintaining annual “core projects” such as the Chinese New Year Banquet, Senior’s Visitation, Volunteer Appreciation, Picnic in the Park, Casino, AGM and Social Events. In addition, “special one time projects” (e.g. 40th Anniversary and Builders

and Patriots 2) will continue to be introduced on a merit-based and opportunistic basis.

Key strategies defined in the Visioning sessions included a periodic review of the Strategic Plan on a quarterly and annual basis; a review and update of current project criteria; an increase in administrative capacity through new hires or volunteer positions (Administrator, Communications Director); an increase in Board capacity and strength through education and skills development; and a commitment to increase Sien Lok Park usership by finalizing the Master Plan and conducting a Park Safety Audit and user surveys to address needs.

Another major strategy that was defined in the sessions was the updating and refining of the current Communications Plan. The plan would involve establishment of a new Communications Director and Committee, to create a more effective dialogue with our current members and to attract new membership. Additional measures will include the enhancement of our website and communication materials; introduction of surveys and focus groups to better service our membership and the gradual increase in bilingualism in our graphical and spoken representations of the Society.

On a lighter note, I would like to welcome Mr. Ron C. Lee and Ms. Winnie Ng to our Board. Ron is a respected high school teacher in the community and was the World Convenor for the 2005 Conoco Phillips World Schools Debate Championship held in Calgary. Ron has an extensive volunteer resume, including serving with the Calgary Exhibition & Stampede as a Senior Associate, Shareholder and Chairman for developing educational programs for K-12. His management and leadership skills will certainly be remarkable additions to Sien Lok.

Winnie Ng is an Investment and Retirement Planner with Royal Bank of Canada. She also has previous experience as a Life Insurance and Investment Agent and a Financial Advisor for CIBC and TD Canada Trust. Her knowledge of the Financial Services sector and her multilingualism (English, Mandarin and Cantonese) will be very strong assets for the Board.

With new additions to the Board, come unfortunately, some retirements. At this time, I would like to thank Ms. Katey Fok, assistant Treasurer, for her contributions over the last two years. The Sien Lok Society would like to wish Katey continued success in her future endeavors.

The 40th Chinese New Year Banquet scheduled is for Saturday, January 31, 2009 at the Regency Palace Seafood Restaurant. If you need more information or would like to buy tickets, please contact Cori Louis-Smith, the chair for this event at [smithdcj@shaw.ca](mailto:smithdcj@shaw.ca).

## Builders & Patriots 2 – Call for Participation and Volunteers

The Sien Lok Society of Calgary is proud to produce a 2010 photo exhibition tentatively entitled “**Builders and Patriots II – A History of Calgary's Chinatown**” as a sequel to its original 2005 **Builders & Patriots: Portraits of Chinese Canadians** photo exhibit.

The upcoming sequel will focus on the history of Calgary's Chinatown from its very beginnings

and aims to inspire, educate and celebrate the proud history of Chinese Canadians in the Calgary area. This exhibit also appropriately commemorates the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of an historic Calgary event – the preservation of Chinatown from demolition in 1969.

We are looking for people willing to share their own personal stories, recollections, and photographs that led to the development of Calgary's historic Chinatown as we know it today.

Categories for the exhibition will include a history (starting from 1885 – present) of important buildings, a selection of businesses, and organizations/associations. Also included (starting from 1885 – 1957) will be a selection of notable residents and stories of people/families related to any of these topics. The opening of this new exhibit is tentatively scheduled for May 2010.

Our aim is to create an exhibition for the community that includes researched historical fact, but also to bring to light a collection of stories about the real personalities and faces behind Calgary's Chinatown with your help. The benefits of your involvement include:

- Participating in a meaningful and thoughtful exhibition that will be on display for a minimum of two weeks and which may be commissioned to travel across Canada.
- Giving future generations a glimpse into the historic past.
- Being honoured as contributors during the unveiling celebration of the photo exhibition.

We are also welcoming volunteers to assist the Exhibitions committee with the creation of this exhibit. This is a very exciting project to be a part of as a volunteer, as your efforts will go towards

something that will celebrate and enlighten our community on an important part of Calgary's history. Currently, the following volunteer positions are available:

### **Interviewers**

- Meet with participating individuals or associations and conduct interviews to gather relevant information
- Discern what information is needed from interviewees according to Research Guide
- Ask questions of relevance and record answers (either by taking notes or using a tape recorder)
- Acquire supporting photographs to support stories and have them scanned
- Bilingualism (English and Cantonese, or even Toisanese) would be an asset

### **Scanners**

- Scan relevant photographs into computer
- Ensure the digital image created is complete and is of usable quality if not excellent
- Track all digital images by assigning the appropriate file numbers, and updating the tracking list
- Assist Interviewer as needed when there are no images to be scanned

### **Interview Translators**

- Translate the interview for unilingual interviewers
- For example, if person (s) being interviewed only speaks Chinese, and interviewer speaks English, an interview translator will be needed

### **Logistics Assistants**

- Assist both the Community Outreach and the Exhibition side with various logistical tasks as needed. A couple examples might be:
- For the Community Outreach side, assisting the teams with contacting

various members of the community/organizations and help set up meetings

- For the Exhibition side, to find out costs for possibly needed exhibition installation items, such as easels, paints, lights, etc.

### **Exhibition Translators**

- Translate all written actual exhibition content or other related documents from English to Chinese, or vice versa
- Writing and reading fluency in both English and Chinese are a must!
- Photo exhibit will be offered in English, Traditional and Simplified Chinese

### **Exhibition Editors**

- Edit all types of information (from actual exhibition to other related documents) that has been translated from English to Chinese, or vice versa to ensure accuracy
- Writing and reading fluency in both English and Chinese are a must!

## **What's Happening with Sien Lok Park?**

A session for devising a Master Plan for Sien Lok Park was held in March 2007 and was lead by Peter Wiseman, Landscape Architect. We will have the final draft completed and follow through with its implementation in the early spring of 2009. Some of the goals for the park's use are:

- To become a central outdoor gathering space to celebrate Chinese Cultural events and activities.
- To be recognized as a welcoming place for all Calgarians regardless of age, ethnicities or beliefs.

- To reflect the contributions made by the Chinese community to Canada and the southern Alberta region.
- To be a park that embraces its location adjacent to one of Calgary's greatest natural features, the Bow River.

Some of the current issues facing the park are:

- Riverfront Avenue splits the park into two distinct pieces making it a less efficient use of land.
- Effect of existing and proposed adjacent high rise buildings on the Park's use.
- A desire to upgrade facilities such as play ground equipment and monuments.
- Safety concerns regarding park use, including the crossing of Riverfront Avenue during peak traffic times.
- Integrating the park better with the current river walk and park system.
- Poor signage identification.
